 Protect & enhance region's primary economic drivers Universities, Agriculture, Downtown Columbia/Business District, Military, etc.)

Efficient Development & Green Space

- Promote use of vacant lots/parcels
- Support healthy, vibrant neighborhoods
- Protect open space for regional parks and permanent preservation
